Romans 14:13-23 | *will be preached on May 26, 2024*

1. Identify two or three ways that this section is connected to what Paul has said earlier in the book. You might think about the immediate context (Romans 13:8-14:12) or the book as a whole.
2. What is the main idea of this passage? For the mixed congregation of Jews and Gentiles, what did Paul want them to do differently? In your opinion, which verse best captures the theme of this section?
3. What are some issues in our lives today where Christians come to different conclusions about acceptable and unacceptable behavior?
4. This passage addresses the tension between (a) individual convictions and (b) corporate welfare. What happens when we choose *either/or* rather than *both/and*?
5. In light of the truth in this passage, how can others pray for you?
