2. Based on the surrounding context, what do you think Paul means in v. 14 when he says, “all Israel will be saved”?

3. Suppose someone appealed to Romans 11:32 to claim that God will save every human being in the end. Is this what that verse is teaching? Why or why not?

4. How does this passage inform the way that Gentile Christians should relate to Jewish people today?

5. In light of the truth in this passage, how can others pray for you?
